

MOTION TO RECOMMIT WITH INSTRUCTIONS

_____ moves to recommit the bill H.R. 5116 to the Committee on Science and Technology with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendment:

Strike page 91, line 9, through page 98, line 4.

Strike page 163, line 3, through page 164, line 11.

Strike page 176, line 15, through page 187, line 13.

Strike page 187, line 14, through page 195, line 11.

Strike page 235, line 15, through page 244, line 1.

Page 245, lines 12 through 24, amend section 702 to read as follows:

1 **SEC. 702. PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.**

2 For the purposes of the activities and programs sup-
3 ported by this Act and the amendments made by this
4 Act—

5 (1) institutions of higher education chartered to
6 serve large numbers of students with disabilities, in-
7 cluding Gallaudet University, Landmark College,
8 and the National Technical Institute for the Deaf,
9 and institutions of higher education offering science,

1 technology, engineering, and mathematics research
2 and education activities and programs available to
3 veterans with disabilities, shall receive special consid-
4 eration and have a designation consistent with the
5 designation for other institutions that serve popu-
6 lations underrepresented in STEM to ensure that in-
7 stitutions of higher education chartered to serve or
8 serving persons with disabilities benefit from such
9 research and education activities and programs; and
10 (2) agencies for which appropriations are au-
11 thorized by this Act or the amendments made by
12 this Act shall also conduct outreach to veterans with
13 disabilities pursuing studies in science, technology,
14 engineering, and mathematics to ensure that such
15 veterans are aware of and benefit from the research
16 and education activities and programs authorized by
17 this Act.

At the end of the bill, insert the following new sec-
tions:

18 **SEC. 704. NO SALARIES FOR VIEWING PORNOGRAPHY.**

19 None of the funds authorized under this Act may be
20 used to pay the salary of any individual who has been offi-
21 cially disciplined for violations of subpart G of the Stand-
22 ards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive
23 Branch for viewing, downloading, or exchanging pornog-

1 raphy, including child pornography, on a Federal Govern-
2 ment computer or while performing official Federal Gov-
3 ernment duties.

4 **SEC. 705. INELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS OR GRANTS.**

5 None of the funds authorized under this Act shall be
6 available to make awards to or provide grants for an insti-
7 tution of higher education under this Act if that institu-
8 tion is prevented from receiving funds for contracts or
9 grants for education under section 983 of title 10, United
10 States Code.

11 **SEC. 706. ALTERNATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS.**

12 Notwithstanding sections 212, 402, 611, and 622, in
13 any year following a year in which there is a Federal budg-
14 et deficit the authorization levels in those sections and the
15 amendments made by those sections shall be in the
16 amount specified as follows:

17 (1) ALTERNATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS FOR THE
18 NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to
20 be appropriated to the Foundation
21 \$6,872,510,400 for each of the fiscal years
22 2011 through 2013.

23 (B) SPECIFIC ALLOCATIONS.—Of the
24 amount authorized under subparagraph (A) for
25 each fiscal year—

1 (i) \$5,563,920,400 shall be made
2 available for research and related activities;

3 (ii) \$872,760,000 shall be made avail-
4 able for education and human resources;

5 (iii) \$117,290,000 shall be made
6 available for major research equipment and
7 facilities construction;

8 (iv) \$300,000,000 shall be made avail-
9 able for agency operations and award man-
10 agement;

11 (v) \$4,540,000 shall be made available
12 for the Office of the National Science
13 Board; and

14 (vi) \$14,000,000 shall be made avail-
15 able for the Office of Inspector General.

16 (2) ALTERNATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS FOR THE
17 NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF STANDARDS AND TECH-
18 NOLOGY.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to
20 be appropriated to the Secretary of Commerce
21 \$839,300,000 for the National Institute of
22 Standards and Technology for each of the fiscal
23 years 2011 through 2013.

1 (B) SPECIFIC ALLOCATIONS.—Of the
2 amount authorized under subparagraph (A) for
3 each fiscal year—

4 (i) \$515,000,000 shall be authorized
5 for scientific and technical research and
6 services laboratory activities;

7 (ii) \$120,000,000 shall be authorized
8 for the construction and maintenance of
9 facilities; and

10 (iii) \$204,300,000 shall be authorized
11 for industrial technology services activities,
12 of which—

13 (I) \$70,000,000 shall be author-
14 ized for the Technology Innovation
15 Program under section 28 of the Na-
16 tional Institute of Standards and
17 Technology Act (15 U.S.C. 278n);

18 (II) \$124,700,000 shall be au-
19 thorized for the Manufacturing Exten-
20 sion Partnership program under sec-
21 tions 25 and 26 of such Act (15
22 U.S.C. 278k and 278l); and

23 (III) \$9,600,000 shall be author-
24 ized for the Malcolm Baldrige Na-
25 tional Quality Award program under

1 section 17 of the Stevenson-Wydler
2 Technology Innovation Act of 1980
3 (15 U.S.C. 3711a).

4 (3) ALTERNATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS FOR THE
5 OFFICE OF SCIENCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EN-
6 ERGY.—There are authorized to be appropriated to
7 the Secretary for the activities of the Office of
8 Science \$4,904,000,000 for each of the fiscal years
9 2011 through 2013, of which for each fiscal year—

10 (A) \$1,637,000,000 shall be for Basic En-
11 ergy Sciences activities under section 604;

12 (B) \$604,000,000 shall be for Biological
13 and Environmental Research activities under
14 section 605; and

15 (C) \$394,000,000 shall be for Advanced
16 Scientific Computing Research activities under
17 section 606.

18 (4) ALTERNATIVE AUTHORIZATIONS FOR ARPA-
19 E.—No funds are authorized to be appropriated to
20 the Director of ARPA-E for deposit into the Fund
21 for fiscal years 2011 through 2013.
